"I Trust You Jesus, Lead the Way"

This is what the Lord says: "When seventy years are completed for Babylon, I will come to you and fulfill my good promise to bring you back to this place. ¹¹ For I know the plans I have for you," declares the Lord, "plans to prosper you and not to harm you, plans to give you hope and a future. ¹² Then you will call on me and come and pray to me, and I will listen to you. ¹³ You will seek me and find me when you seek me with all your heart. ¹⁴ I will be found by you," declares the Lord, "and will restore your fortunes. I will gather you from all the nations and places where I have banished you," declares the Lord, "and will bring you back to the place from which I carried you into exile." Jeremiah 29:10-14

I am a planner. Each morning, before my feet touch the floor, I mentally review my agenda for the day. I try to make the most of every moment. On days when I don't accomplish everything I set out to do, I often end the day feeling frustrated and disappointed with myself for not "doing enough."

Over time, I've realized that this idea of "enough" is something I've created in my own mind. It's where my perfectionism and sense of self-worth can easily take over, leaving me distracted and uneasy rather than grateful and at peace.

Scripture reminds me that the way I plan my life is not always the way God plans it. In Jeremiah 29:11, God speaks words of hope to the people through the prophet Jeremiah, assuring them that the Lord's plans are for their good—even when those plans look very different from what they expected. When our plans are delayed, altered, or even undone, God's plans are still unfolding, bringing hope and a future we may not yet see.

These words took on deeper meaning for me after reading *Jesus Calling: Enjoying Peace in His Presence* by Sarah Young. She writes, "I want you to learn a new habit. Try saying, 'I trust You,

Jesus,' in response to whatever happens to you." I realized how rarely I say those words—out loud and with intention—especially when my carefully laid plans begin to unravel.

As we enter a new year, I want to learn that habit. I want to begin each day grounded in the truth that the Lord knows the plans He has for us—plans to prosper us and not to harm us, plans to give us hope and a future. My response to God this year is simple: "I trust You, Jesus. Lead the way."

Understanding the context of Jeremiah's words makes this promise even more powerful. Jerusalem had been captured by Babylon, and many of the people—particularly leaders and those with education and influence—were taken into exile. Though Babylon was a place where they could live comfortably and contribute to the community, it was not home. Through Jeremiah, God told them that although they longed to return, it was not yet time. For seventy years they would live in exile, learning how to remain faithful, trusting that God was still guiding their lives.

Trusting God, then and now, requires more than hopeful wishing. It calls for faithful action—aligning our lives with God's direction, even when the outcome is unclear. Faith is not passive; it is lived out daily as we place our plans, our hopes, and our future in God's hands.

As we begin this new year, may we remain dedicated to God, allow God to guide our paths, and trust that—even when life doesn't go according to plan—God's plans are always rooted in love.



Groce and Home Depot Volunteers Ready Space to Relocate Warrior Canine Connection

Groce based Warrior Canine Connection (WCC) is relocating from Charter Hall to the lower level of the Epworth building on January 2nd. WCC, under the leadership of Amy Guidash, Program Manager, has been located in Charter Hall since 2019, operating basically Monday through Friday. WCC enlists recovering veterans in a therapeutic mission of learning to train service dogs for their fellow veterans.

Will Troxell, Trustees Chairperson (stepping down December 31st after 6+ years – thank you Will!!), and Amy, collaborated in 2025 to plan the relocation into 4 rooms in the lower level of the Epworth building with one of WCC's sponsors, Home Depot, providing significant materials and funding for the renovations including a 5th room that is currently used by the Girl Scouts Brownies group and Alcohols Anonymous.

On December 4th Home Depot volunteers kicked off the renovation effort by removing a number of built-in storage closets and starting the flooring work. Since then, Bob Briggs and True Morse have continued the flooring work, Lonnie Davis of Davis Mechanical installed heating and cooling units, Loring McIntyre upgraded the parking area, the United Methodist Men trimmed the trees along the lane to the lower level and hauled off demolition debris, Interior Painting of Asheville donated labor and material to paint the rooms on December 23rd and 24th, and Boyd McNeely (the Christmas tree lot) loaded and hauled off the trimmed brush and limbs for free on December 26rh.

This is such a benefit for both WCC and Groce, as WCC will be in a more functional space for their needs, the Epworth rooms are dramatically improved, and Charter Hall can be used for many other functions supporting God's work at Groce.
