own property in Biltmore. It has been in my family for over 60 years. It had never flooded before hurricane Helene hit Asheville and western North Carolina on 27th of September, 2024.

Biltmore regularly floods. The local news station always sets up on the corner of my building to film the devastation in Biltmore Village. Every few years I would price out flood insurance. In fact, my tenant had just priced out flood insurance 2 months before the hurricane. It was \$30,000. I could never afford that. So each time, before major flooding was forecasted and WLOS TV camped out on my property, I prayed and asked God to put his hand over my building and protect my little island.

14 months before hurricane Helene, I received a letter from my insurance company; thanking me for being such a great customer the last 30 years and asking if I wanted to consider any additional insurance products. Of course, on the top of the list was flood insurance. I laid that letter down on my counter and

just laughed. I told God that just for giggles I would call and let them run another estimate.

My agent called back the next day, and said I have something that I think might work for you. It is a \$436,211 catastrophic flood policy for your building for a cost of \$1,743. I immediately thought "OK \$1,743 a month. I might could swing that let me pray about it." To which my agent replied, "My dear, that's for the year!"

So what do you think? Is it possible that God knew that hurricane Helene would devastate us? And why me? What have I ever done to deserve His provision and incredible mercy?

Yet, I am confident that He is the One that provided. Like so many, I am striving to rebuild from the wreckage while I share that the Provider is the Faithful One; my Hope and Protector.




