Do you remember what Valentine's Day was like as a child? In the weeks leading up to it, we'd bring an empty shoebox to school and decorate it with construction paper, hearts, and anything else we could find. Our teacher would cut a slit in the top so our classmates could drop their Valentine's cards inside.

Shopping for Valentine's cards was part of the excitement. We'd head to the store with our parents to pick out the perfect set for our classmates. When I was in elementary school, the "cool kids" brought cards that included candy, pencils, or small gifts. Most of us just had simple cards with our names on them.

I remember carefully choosing a card for each person, going through the class list to match the right design to each name. Looking back, I realize most kids probably didn't notice. They might not have even looked at their cards after getting home—unless there was candy or a prize attached.

As we grew older – into high school, college, and adulthood –Valentine's Day took on new meanings. Some people were showered with flowers, stuffed animals, or large boxes of chocolates. For them, it was a day of love and celebration. But for others, it was a lonely reminder of what they didn't have. Few things feel emptier than receiving nothing on a day that seems to highlight how much others are loved. While it's important to express love and appreciation to those close to us, we should also remember that some people don't know what it feels like to be loved so deeply.

Thankfully, God's love is different. It doesn't rely on gifts or special occasions. John 3:16-17 tells us: "For God so loved the world that he gave his only begotten Son, so that everyone who believes in him may not perish but may have eternal life. Indeed, God did not send the Son into the world to condemn the world, but in order that the world might be saved through him."

God's love is unconditional, constant, and all-encompassing. No matter how lonely or forgotten we may feel, we are deeply loved by Him. With God, every day is Valentine's Day, a reminder of His eternal love for us all.
